Buprenorphine training coming to OKC

If you had a family member addicted to an opiate, would you want a safe, effective treatment to be available close to home? From 1992 to 2000, the number of new opioid abusers in the United States grew by 225%. In the same period, new abuse of a prescription opioid among 12 to 17 year olds was up an astounding 542%, more than four times the rate of increase among adults.

The Oklahoma Psychiatric Physicians Association and the American Psychiatric Association urge physicians to be a part of the solution to this public health crisis in our community. We invite you to obtain the training necessary to treat opiate addiction using buprenorphine, a safe and effective medication.

Buprenorphine and Office-Based Treatment of Opioid Dependence training has been scheduled in Oklahoma City on Saturday, June 3, 2006 from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at the Embassy Suites, 1815 South Meridian. Program faculty include Jane Kennedy, D.O., University of Colorado School of Medicine, Denver; Adam Gordon, M.D., MPH, Assistant Professor of Medicine, University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, Pittsburgh and Jonathan Ritvo, M.D., Denver Health Medical Center, Denver.

Registration fee for APA/OPPA members is \$100; non-APA/OPPA members is \$150 and \$75 for non-physicians. Psychiatric residents will be admitted free. *All registration fees will go to the Oklahoma Psychiatric Physicians Association.*

This program is part of a national training initiative, which has been endorsed by the Federal Center for Substance Abuse Treatment and is sponsored by the American Psychiatric Association and the Oklahoma Psychiatric Physicians Association and qualifies for 8 hours Category 1 CME through the Oklahoma Institute for Mental Health Education and Training and for 8 hours Category 1-B credit under the American Osteopathic Association. Physicians who complete this course will be eligible to request a waiver to practice medication-assisted addiction therapy with buprenorphine for the treatment of opioid dependence.

presented and critiqued. By doing so, residents are encourage to present their work and engage the community of psychiatry in an intellectually stimulating and informative discourse. *

Child Psychiatry (Dr. Brent Bell) – The ODMHSAS Child Conference is set for April 26-28 in Tulsa. Also, there will be a new Medicaid provider effective July 1. The provider is a medicaid management company from Maryland. Shadow Mountain in Tulsa is opening a new Reactive Attachment Disorder Unit and a new 12-bed child and adolescent crisis unit will be located in Tulsa.

Continuing Education (Dr. Shree Vinekar) – Thank you to the Oklahoma Council of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and especially to the work done by Drs. Ethan Lindsay and Heather Geis for securing a co-sponsorship for our annual CME conference. Also, thanks to Dr. Ana Maria Gutierrez for her work in getting the child psychiatrists involved with the meeting and thanks to Dr. Jenny Boyer for being available to present Saturday afternoon in case Dr. Willis Holloway is detained.

Legislative (Dr. Jenny Boyer) – The OSMA is to meet with Rep. Kris Steele, R-Shawnee, one of the House authors of House Bill 2842, the Medicaid Reform Act. At present mental health is carved out. Dr. Boyer spoke with Sen. Tom Adelson, D-OKC and a Senate author, and he indicated that mental health may not be carved out, but paid less. Our lobbyists are tracking this bill carefully.

Membership (Dr. Katherine Klaassen) - The APA now has an automatic transfer process where members are transferred to the district branch where they currently live. Eight OPPA members have automatically been transferred to other district branches. In turn, two new members have transferred to Oklahoma including Drs. Katherine Propes, Tulsa and Scott Moseman, Tulsa. Three members have reinstated including Drs. Elizabeth Cordes, Oklahoma City: Jeannie Helmbright, Enid and Robert Hensley. Tahlequah. Congratulations to our new Life Members, Drs. Paul Lanier and Dominic Losacco. Public Information (Dr. Art Rousseau) - There is not a psychologist prescription bill currently in the legislature. Our lobbyists have reported the PatientsFirst Coalition has made a significant impact on the filing of scope of practice bills this year. The coalition met recently at the State Capitol and was pleased at the number of psychiatrists present. The Patients First Coalition was submitted for the APA's 2006 Best Practice Award. If OPPA wins, Drs. Masters and Gutierrez are attending the APA annual meeting and volunteered to accept the award on behalf of OPPA.

Resident Reports – Dr. Charles Dukes will be the resident representative from Griffin Memorial Hospital on the Council.

2006-07 Executive Council — The results of the election were announced. Dr. Fossey volunteered to release his Council seat. Dr. Gleason accepted. Council approved the motion to offer the Councilor seat to Stan Ardoin, M.D., new Residency Training Director at Griffin Memorial Hospital. *

The 39th annual **Benjamin Rush Awards** for the outstanding senior students in psychiatry from the Oklahoma City and Tulsa medical schools were announced at the annual meeting of the Oklahoma Psychiatric Physicians Association held April 7-8, 2006 in Oklahoma City.

Honored were graduating seniors **Kari Youman**, University of Oklahoma School of Medicine, Tulsa campus, and **Nicole Shadid Folger**, University of Oklahoma Medical School, Oklahoma City campus. Each will receive a certificate and a \$250 cash award.

KariYouman, who was unable to attend the ceremony as she was participating in an international rotation by working in a clinic in Santa Cruz, Bolivia, performed exceptionally well and with enthusiasm during her third year clerkship and fourth year externship. She showed excellent judgement in her clinical skills and has a remarkable ability to conceptualize and integrate knowledge. Kari is eager to learn, very organized and will be an outstanding resident. She has impressed the attending faculty with her knowledge base, clinical skills, attitude and diligence.
